The SID will be a huge win for Hoboken businesses. Personally, I would like to see it aid in the revival of I4th Street. When I was a kid, I4th Street was a legit happening spot. Small changes such as cohesive signage, sidewalk beautification and more diverse transportation options can help make it a true destination.

I am a huge fan of the Hop, the city sponsored shuttle buses that run throughout the city. I support expanding service to include weekends, which I think would be great for Hoboken businesses.
